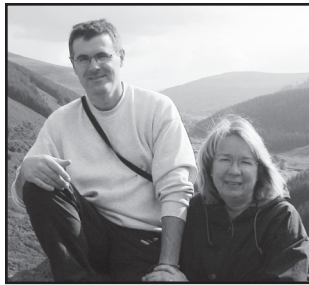

We cherish your prayers and visits. Our church has blossomed to 18 nationalities with Bible college meeting three times a week aside from our three weekly services. This spring we graduate our first Bible college class and presently we are showing three DVD classes from MBC&S.

We have a burden to reach the Moslem world and have been investing in the Iranian and Turkish communities. Pray that God anoints us and gives revelation to these precious ones and that he will raise up more specialists to reach the various people groups in Londonistan (Moslem-world alias name for London)

In September, we took a group visit Pastor Matti and team in Istanbul. In November, we had Pastor Schaller as guest speaker at the conference we hosted with 200 coming from our European churches. We are thankful for the eternal investment that he made. Just recently we took a group to visit the church in Nimes, France. It was an awesome time and it was our first visit back since we left there 22 years ago for Chester, England, to plant a church there.

We had a great New Year's conference with Pastor Jon Boyce from London, England. It was what they called the Big Freeze over here, -6 centigrade (cold for here), it was the Big Freeze partly because of how cold it was and partly for how long it lasted. Anyway, it meant we got snowed out of the mountain Christian center we had booked for the church weekend. So we switched it to a hotel, and it went great for everyone with the last-minute switch. It was very encouraging for us, a good way to start the New Year off. The Christian center offered us the place for May 21st weekend, which is a beautiful time to go there.

For Sunday service, we rent a school every week; it's a good facility, but closes for the school holidays, which means we have to go on tour from time to time! So if you think of us, please pray for us as we seek for a more permanent meeting place. We are trying a new outreach study, a sort of 'what is Christianity' course, in an area we've been evangelizing in for a while. It'll run eight weeks starting mid-February.

Peruvians in the Andes, along the Amazon and the long Pacific coast are right now thirsting and hungering for spiritual truth. Thanks to God's grace, we are telling them this Truth. And guess what? They can tell the difference between this Truth and the half-truth (total lie) they are accustomed to hearing. God bears witness to His Story!

Here are some notes from January 2010 missions trips and our churches in Peru: In Iquitos, right on the Amazon, the Lord's hand is evident. When I did sketchboard in the Plaza de Armas, a crowd gathered, listening to the good news. I think they all heard the Gospel, but then a huge rainforest thunderstorm swept in and the people ran for cover. All except this young man, Enrique, who stood still in the pouring rain and trusted in Jesus. Soaked and standing under the awning of a small restaurant a little later, he asked if he could be baptized. This provoked laughter among us because we looked like we had all just come out of the Jordan. We will baptize him soon, maybe in the Amazon. We also left DVDs of Biblical Psychology class with a beautiful local assembly that we had met last year. We don't have a pastor here yet, but we can benefit the Body of Christ with some free Bible College classes in the meantime.

In Cajamarca, tucked into a mountain valley, the Spirit of God penetrated the hearts of over 100 people who burst into spontaneous applause upon hearing the Gospel message preached through a sketchboard story. Dozens answered the call unto faith in Christ Jesus.

In Trujillo, Pastor Justin Schaller is living temporarily with Julio Montoya and family, becoming fluent in Spanish and building up the church. Last Sunday night, 10-12 new people accompanied us from sketchboard outreach to the house church service to hear more. We were about 30 in the living room, spilling over into the dining area. Julio will soon be expanding to three meetings a week from the one he now directs, and Bible college here will begin next month! Meanwhile, Julio continues to take the overnight bus to Lima every Friday night for our eight hours of Bible college each Saturday. He aims to graduate in another year and a half!

In Mazamari's hilly jungle, Pastor Jorge is shepherding some disciples into grace thinking. He's in Lima now to get more Bible college DVDs and material. God always blesses humble men. A new GGWO work is just beginning in Oxapampa, central Peru. Pray for Pastor Cesar and Norma Succar! In Lima, we are now four churches who love to be with each other very, very much. Angelica Gamarra, Chorrillos, Huandoy and Zarate are all growing together in the communion with our Lord and Saviour.

Lastly, for now, Carlos and Iris Ascue have moved from Peru to the eastern coast of Australia, and have started a Spanish Bible Study in their home with the hope to have a GGWO church there. They take our Bible College classes over the Internet. Thanks for your prayers. As you can see, they are not in vain.
